Ecclesiastes 2:12-26

¹²⁻¹⁴ And then I took a hard look at what's smart and what's stupid. What's left to do after you've been king? That's a hard act to follow. You just do what you can, and that's it. But I did see that it's better to be smart than stupid, just as light is better than darkness. Even so, though the smart ones see where they're going and the stupid ones grope in the dark, they're all the same in the end. One fate for all—and that's it.

¹⁵⁻¹⁶When I realized that my fate's the same as the fool's, I had to ask myself, "So why bother being wise?" It's all smoke, nothing but smoke. The smart and the stupid both disappear out of sight. In a day or two they're both forgotten. Yes, both the smart and the stupid die, and that's it.

¹⁷ I hate life. As far as I can see, what happens on earth is a bad business. It's smoke—and spitting into the wind. ¹⁸⁻¹⁹ And I hated everything I'd accomplished and accumulated on this earth. I can't take it with me—no, I have to leave it to whoever comes after me. Whether they're worthy or worthless—and who's to tell?—they'll take over the earthly results of my intense thinking and hard work. Smoke.

²⁰⁻²³ That's when I called it quits, gave up on anything that could be hoped for on this earth. What's the point of working your fingers to the bone if you hand over what you worked for to someone who never lifted a finger for it? Smoke, that's what it is. A bad business from start to finish. So what do you get from a life of hard labor? Pain and grief from dawn to dusk. Never a decent night's rest. Nothing but smoke.

²⁴⁻²⁶ The best you can do with your life is have a good time and get by the best you can. The way I see it, that's it—divine fate. Whether we feast or fast, it's up to God. God may give wisdom and knowledge and joy to his favorites, but sinners are assigned a life of hard labor, and end up turning their wages over to God's favorites. Nothing but smoke—and spitting into the wind.

THE ROLE OF FEAR IN VANITY, MADNESS & FOLLY

Genesis 3:8-11

1. The wise <u>dies</u> just like the fool. Wisdom is not the <u>purpose</u> of life.

2. Toiling and striving are a <u>vexation</u>. Accumulation of stuff is not the <u>purpose</u> of life.

3. Fear creates the **false self** and the EGO.

THE ROLE OF JOY IN WISDOM

1. Joy is the experience of acceptance and connection that comes from **vulnerability**.

- 2. Joy requires a **community** that provides **safety**.
- 3. Joy defeats fear and allows acting out of love and that is wisdom.

4. This is the community that only God can provide.
