Knowledge is merely having clarity of facts and truths, while wisdom is the practical ability to make consistently good decisions in life. - 3. This famous passage does not contain marching orders for you. But, rather, this is <u>a description of God's determinations</u>. You are being told that you have been placed in a world that you did not create or fashion, and that this world has various repetitive cycles, to which cycles we have been assigned by someone else. You are under the authority by the hand and purpose of God (Job 14:5; Isaiah 45:6,7; Matthew 10:29-30; James 4:13-17).
