All men have at some time and to some degree experienced having the walls to their heart torn down by the enemy in various ways. Your heart is like a city, which you are to protect from all forms of attack. Your heart is made up of your whole person—your mind, will and emotions. When the walls of your heart are torn down, the enemy has a free access to your mind, your emotions, or your choices. He comes in to deceive you into thinking destructive thoughts about who you are. He comes in to stir up your emotions with anger, confusion, depression, bitterness and shame. He comes in to influence or control your choices. When the walls are torn down you are vulnerable to addictions and uncontrolled thoughts, which invite you to believe lies about yourself and reality. You must confront the lies, be a leader and initiate the work of rebuilding the walls of strength, definition, and leadership. The story of Nehemiah is a narrative of leadership and the rebuilding of a life – a leader in the context of the community of God.

Bible Verses

Nehemiah 6:15,16

The wall was finished on the twenty-fifth day of Elul. It had taken fifty-two days. When all our enemies heard the news and all the surrounding nations saw it, our enemies totally lost their nerve. They knew that God was behind this work.

Nehemiah 5:14-19

From the time King Artaxerxes appointed me as their governor in the land of Judah - from the twentieth to the thirty-second year of his reign, twelve years - neither I nor my brothers used the governor's food allowance. Governors who had preceded me had oppressed the people by taxing them forty shekels of silver (about a pound) a day for food and wine while their underlings bullied the people unmercifully. But out of fear of God I did none of that. I had work to do; I worked on this wall. All my men were on the job to do the work. We didn't have time to line our own pockets. I fed one hundred and fifty Jews and officials at my table in addition to those who showed up from the surrounding nations. One ox, six choice sheep, and some chickens were prepared for me daily, and every ten days a large supply of wine was delivered. Even so, I didn't use the food allowance provided for the governor - the people had it hard enough as it was. Remember in my favor, O my God, Everything I've done for these people.

Joshua 1:7-8

Give it everything you have, heart and soul. Make sure you carry out The Revelation that Moses commanded you, every bit of it. Don't get off track, either left or right, so as to make sure you get to where you're going. And don't for a minute let this Book of The Revelation be out of mind. Ponder and meditate on it day and night, making sure you practice everything written in it. Then you'll get where you're going; then you'll succeed.

Rebuild the Wall – How to Handle Recognition

Nehemiah 6:15,16

Nehemiah: How Do You Handle Recognition - Neh. 5:14-19

- 1. <u>Promotion</u> and <u>Recognition</u> > Nehemiah provides a wonderful model of how to handle success. When Nehemiah was appointed Governor, he discovered that the elite of Israel were selfishly exploiting the poor.
- 2. Promotion brings **privileges**. Nehemiah had a liberal food allowance. Nehemiah chose not to use it (5:14). However, he still fed 150 Jews regularly at his own table—men and officials who were part of his staff. He also regularly entertained visiting dignitaries from the surrounding nations (5:17,18).
- 3. Promotion must never be used to <u>exploit others</u>. Nehemiah did not use those who served him to take advantage of others. He had them working beside him rather than out exploiting the people (5:16).

Nehemiah: A High Calling from God. - Neh. 5:14-19

- 1. <u>Fear of God</u> > Nehemiah did not take advantage of the people because of the fear of God (5:15). He did not violate the law of God, nor did he violate the nature of God.
- 2. <u>Committed</u> & <u>Obedient</u> to God > Nehemiah could not and would not abuse his privileges as Governor. This is also also why he became so furious at the nobles and rulers in Israel who were exploiting the poor by lending them money, charging them exorbitant interest rates, and then confiscating their land and enslaving them when they had nothing left to pay off their debts.
- 3. Sensitive to the <u>Needs of Others</u> > Nehemiah's conscience would not allow him to lay this extra burden on the people. If they were willing to sacrifice their own personal resources and their own personal comforts to achieve God's will, then Nehemiah chose to pick up the tab our of his own personal resources. Nehemiah was a model (Joshua 1:7,8).

HOW YOU CAN RECEIVE RECOGNITION AND HONOR GOD

- 1. Receive recognition as a <u>GIFT from God</u>. See whatever your position, role, or responsibility as a gift from God.
- 2. Receive recognition as an opportunity for <u>personal growth</u>. Increased responsibility stretches you. It provides opportunities to increase your trust in God. It allows you to develop new skills. You need a certain amount of challenge to grow spiritually and psychologically (James 1:2-4).
- 3. Receive recognition to improve your <u>financial situation</u>. It is now wrong to make money. An increased income enables you to give more to meet others' needs and to advance the kingdom of God. Scripture is clear that you are to give proportionately as you prosper (I Cor. 16:2).
- 4. Receive recognition to create working conditions that will benefit and help others. We need Godly leaders (Prov. 29:2).

 - 2. <u>Compassion for People</u> > Never use your position of power to exploit people.
 - **3.** Favored by God > God had his hand on Nehemiah's life.
