

- 2. Self-centered Fear > Everywhere you turn you find yourself at the center of a hostile universe against which you must defend yourself by dishonesty or hostility or withdrawal. You are defiant or abashed, and always feeling shame. AA describes this state as being "an arrogant doormat" or "that piece of garbage around which the entire universe revolves." This is when you must begin to embrace your story and face the wounds from your past. Quote from Pia Mellody.

## **Connected to Real Relationship!**

- 1. Embrace <u>Your Real Self</u> > Neither inferiority—a one down issue— or superiority—a one up issue—provides a framework for healing. Those voices come from childhood trauma.
- 2. Examples of Issues that must be faced:
  - 1. <u>Self-esteem</u> > one down.
  - 2. <u>Boundaries</u> > one up = invulnerability.
  - 3. Reality > one up = perfectionism.
  - 4. <u>Self Care</u> > one up = anti-dependence.
  - **5.** Moderation > one up = controlling rigidity.
