	1.	Burnt Offering = "Surrender" of Christ for the world (Lev. 1).					
	2.	Grain Offering = "Service" of Christ in life (Lev. 2).					
	3.	Fellowship Offering = "Serenity" of Christ in life (Lev. 3).					
	4.	Sin Offering = "Substitute" of Christ for sin (Lev. 4-5:13).					
	5.	Guilt Offering = "Satisfaction" by Christ for demands of God (Lev. 5:14-6:7).

	1.	The Feast of the Sabbath – 23:1-3. Celebrates the finished work of God in creation (Gen. 2:2,3) every 7 th day. NOW, we celebrate					
	_	the finished work of Jesus in redemption as He arose from the grave.					

- The Feasts of the Passover & Unleavened Bread 23:6-8. Celebrated every spring at our Easter time. It was the 4th of July for the children of Israel.
- The Feasts of First Fruits 23:9-14 & Pentecost 23:15-22. Celebrated 50 days after Passover. The Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples 50 days after Christ's resurrection. Pentecost was the birthday of the Church.
- The Feasts of Trumpets 23:23-25. This is the New Year's Day (Rosh Hashanah) of the Jewish people. The feast points forward to the future gathering of the dispersed people of Israel (Zechariah 14:16).
- The Feasts of Tabernacles (Also called the Feasts of Booths). 23:33-36. The last feast of the year. Celebrated the time when the children of Israel lived in tents during their wilderness journey.
- The Sabbatical Year 25:1-7. This was the year of mediation and devotion to be observed every 7 years.
- The Year of Jubilee 28:8-55. Every 50 years all slaves of Israelite blood were freed.

Into the Wilderness: Be Holy!

- → When it comes to the Christian faith, a religious system centered on surrendering your life to a God 1. whom you cannot see, touch or hear, imagination becomes a vital element. Imagination is not the ability to conjure up what is unreal, but the capacity to see what is real but unseen. We are to see with "the eyes of the heart."
- 2. → Holiness comes from the Hebrew word qadowsh which means "to cut." To be holy means to be cut off, or separate, from everything else. To be holy means to be entirely morally pure, all the time and in every way possible.
- 3. → Without the holiness of God, there would be no moral law to which every human being is responsible. Without holiness there would be no divine anger with sin. Without the holiness of God, there would be no hope of a new heaven and earth where holiness will reign over us and in us forever.

- 4. ______ ➤ Every thought, every desire, every word, every choice and every action must be done in a spirit of humble surrender to the commands of God. God calls us to be holy, then sends his Holy Spirt to live inside of us so that we would have the wisdom and strength that we need to surrender to his holy call in all that we do.
- 5. ______ Be Holy! Impossible! Because of His grace, we're accepted and not rejected by Him. Because of His grace, we become aware of the gravity of the sin that infects all of us. Because of His grace, we run to God for help and not away from him in fear. Grace is a WELCOME to us to run to Him.

<u>I Peter 4:1,2 -</u> 1 Since Jesus went through everything you're going through and more, learn to think like him. Think of your sufferings as a weaning from that old sinful habit of always expecting to get your own way. 2 Then you'll be able to live out your days free to pursue what God wants instead of being tyrannized by what you want.

Leviticus 19:1,2; 20:24-26 - 1 God spoke to Moses: 2 "Speak to the congregation of Israel. Tell them: Be holy because I, God, your God, am holy. 24 "I've told you, remember, that you will possess their land that I'm giving to you as an inheritance, a land flowing with milk and honey. I am God, your God, who has distinguished you from the nations. 25 So live like it: Distinguish between ritually clean and unclean animals and birds. Don't pollute yourselves with any animal or bird or crawling thing which I have marked out as unclean for you. 26 Live holy lives before me because I, God, am holy. I have distinguished you from the nations to be my very own.

<u>Isaiah 6:1-8 -</u> 1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Master sitting on a throne - high, exalted! - and the train of his robes filled the Temple. 2 Angelseraphs hovered above him, each with six wings. With two wings they covered their faces, with two their feet, and with two they flew." 3 And they called back and forth one to the other, Holy, Holy, Holy is God-of-the-Angel-Armies. His bright glory fills the whole earth. 4 The foundations trembled at the sound

of the angel voices, and then the whole house filled with smoke. 5 I said, "Doom! It's Doomsday! I'm as good as dead! Every word I've ever spoken is tainted - blasphemous even! And the people I live with talk the same way, using words that corrupt and desecrate. And here I've looked God in the face! The King! God-of-the-Angel-Armies!" 6 Then one of the angel-seraphs flew to me. He held a live coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. 7 He touched my mouth with the coal and said, "Look. This coal has touched your lips. Gone your guilt, your sins wiped out." 8 And then I heard the voice of the Master: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" I spoke up, "I'll go. Send me!"

Romans 12:1,2 - 1 So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life - your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life - and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him.

2 Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you.
