Joshu	a – Ready to Lead – Committed to the Book.
1.	→ Moses wrote the Book (Ex. 17:14). This book became the center of
	the life of the people of Israel (Deut. 31:9-13). The people were to know the content that God had
	given through Moses in the book. God commanded His words be written in a book. Moses wrote
	it over a period of 40 years. When Moses completed the Pentateuch, he commanded that it be kept
	in a sacred place (Deut. 31:26). It was to be preserved and read regularly to all the people.
2.	→ Joshua was commanded to remember the Book as he
۷.	assumed leadership (Joshua 1:1-8). God was clear about 3 things:
	1→ The law as not to depart out of Joshua's mouth.
	2→ He was to meditate on it day and night.
	3→ He was to practice the commands daily.
3.	→ Joshua was given an objective standard to judge everything else,
	and the standard was so clear that God expected the ordinary people to understand it when it was
	periodically read to them. Moses wrote, and Moses died. Joshua continued to write; the Book
	continued to grow.

	→ There is no greater joy than to "feel" completely loved as a child.
2.	→ No higher honor than to believe in Jesus and want to model your life after his
۷.	teachings and example.

3.	→ Being someone who cares for others and is part of a Team (John 15:15).
4.	→ The desire to help others find peace and purpose in Jesus.
5.	→ We "house" the presence of God. Be respectful of how you care for yourself.
	We can share the fullness of God's gifts with others.
7.	→ We are ready for daily direction from God (John 14:26).
The L	and—Manhood: Loved & Declaration.
1.	→ We must experience the love of Jesus and believe that God really loves
	us without reservation, unconditionally, just as we are. We need to feel the real presence of Jesus
	and be filled with character and conduct that validates our belief (Galatians 5:22-23; James 4:6)! We
	must receive the love of God before we can offer it to others.
2.	→ We need to declare our identity" in Christ" and be clear about the
	purpose and meaning of our life.
