Galatians 5:1 Romans 5:20, 21 Ephesians 2:8-10

TAKE THE MASK OFF – TO PLEASE OR TO TRUST?

- 1. MOTIVE → Pleasing God and Trusting God represent the ultimate motives of our hearts. See Gal. 3:1-3; Proverbs 3:5, 6; Heb. 11:6.
- **2.** SIN MANAGEMENT → If my motive is an unwavering determination to Please God, then by VALUE will be striving to be all God wants me to be and my ACTION will be working on my sin to achieve an intimate relationship with God. See Gal. 6:15.
- 3. MISERABLE → When we strive to sin less, we don't sin less.
- **4.** ENSLAVED → Pleasing God is an incredibly good longing. It always will be. It just can't be our primary motivation, or is will imprison our hearts.
- 5. <u>FREEDOM</u> → If my motive is Trusting God, then my VALUE will be living out of who God says I AM and my ACTION will be standing with God, with my sin in front of us, working on it together.

TAKE THE MASK OFF – TO PLEASE OR TO TRUST?

- 6. <u>SELF DECEPTION</u> → Many people say they have taken the path of **Trusting God** but have ended up in *The Room of Good Intentions*. This is called The Great Disconnect. See Rev. 3:15-22.
- 7. <u>UNAWARE</u> → God is not interested in changing the Christian. He already has!
- 8. MATURITY → Trust opens the way for God to bring us to maturity. If we do not trust, we do not mature.
- 9. WHO AM I? → If we do not start with trusting who God says we are, we will end up with trusting in our own resources to try to please God. Eph. 3:20, 21
- **10.** EXPERIENCE → Citizens in *The Room of Grace* experience the pleasure of God, because they have pleased him by trusting him. Col. 1:10-12; Rom. 12:1,2; Phil. 4:18; I Thess. 4:1.
