KNOWING OTHERS - CONFLICT - PART I

1.	Proverbs 14:21 $ ightarrow$ Unless you resist the natural urge to justify yourself by comparing and
	looking down at others, your relationships will not survive their normal bumps and turns. Remember: you may have things to learn from people
	who are flawed but through whom God may be accomplishing his purposes.
2.	$-$ Proverbs 16:2 \rightarrow Seeing your part in the rupture can lead to both greater humility and greater gratitude
	and joy at the same time. The humility about the impurity of our motives should prevent us from being too sure of our position and from speaking too strongly against people on the other side of a conflict (Phil. 3:9).
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3.	— Proverbs 29:9 → Avoid engaging a "ranter"—a fool. We are directed to, as much as it is within
	our control, live at peace with the people around us (Rom. 12:18), even those how rage and scoff.
4.	Proverbs 26:17 → It is so easy to be caught up in a conflict that is not your own. If you
	quarrel with someone whose issue is not with you but with someone else, there is no way to resolve it. A wise person should suspend judgment
	(you can't know all the facts) and encourage the parties toward reconciliation.
5.	Proverbs 26:18, 19 $ ightarrow$ Proverbs counsels care in the area of humor. The great danger is that
	our joke may cross the line into cruelty. The wise person makes quick assessment and refrains if there is any danger.
6.	Proverbs 17:19, 26:20, 21 → Some people enjoy debating. Some people are argumentative
	because they cannot distinguish between essential truths worth contending for and secondary or nonessential issues. Others are argumentative
	because their pride makes it hard for them to admit when they are in the wrong.
7.	- Proverbs 22:10 → Mockers' main currency is the insult, the often hilarious and even brilliant
	put-down. But insults are produced by wise-in-their-own-eyes arrogance. A community that cares about the nurture of loving relationships should
	ask the insulter to change—or leave.
8.	Proverbs 16:2 → To "judge" someone means to make a final condemnation (not just a critique of
	something about them), which entails the kind of final knowledge of heart motives that only God has. We should not be naïve, but we should not
	be constantly, habitually suspicious of people, nor be quick to assign motives of envy, pride, resentment, or greed to someone's action when we
	cannot really see into the heart.

<u>Proverbs 17:19 -</u> 19 The person who courts sin, marries trouble; build a wall, invite a burglar.

<u>Proverbs 22:10 -</u> 10 Kick out the troublemakers and things will quiet down; you need a break from bickering and griping!
