3.	– Discern who is trustworthy.
4.	– Develop trustworthiness.
5.	– Set limits to protect trust.
6.	– Rebuild trust when broken.
7.	 Know the difference between trust and forgiveness.

SCRIPTURE – The Message

ACTS 17:24-29 - 24 "The God who made the world and everything in it, this Master of sky and land, doesn't live in custom-made shrines25 or need the human race to run errands for him, as if he couldn't take care of himself. He makes the creatures; the creatures don't make him.26 Starting from scratch, he made the entire human race and made the earth hospitable, with plenty of time and space for living27 so we could seek after God, and not just grope around in the dark but actually find him. He doesn't play hide-and-seek with us. He's not remote; he's near.28 We live and move in him, can't get away from him! One of your poets said it well: 'We're the God-created.'29 Well, if we are the God-created, it doesn't make a lot of sense to think we could hire a sculptor to chisel a god out of stone for us, does it?

Genesis 6:5-8 - 5 God saw that human evil was out of control. People thought evil, imagined evil - evil, evil, evil from morning to night. 6 God was sorry that he had made the human race in the first place; it broke his heart. 7 God said, "I'll get rid of my ruined creation, make a clean sweep: people, animals, snakes and bugs, birds - the works. I'm sorry I made them." 8 But Noah was different. God liked what he saw in Noah.
