	God placed Adam and Eve in a garder	that overflowed with beauty, nourishment, and delight. He met their needs before they even knew them.
	Trust grows in an atmosphere of prov	ision, not pressure. See Genesis 2:8, 9.
2.		Within Relationship.
	God gave freedom first, and then one boundary. He didn't restrict out of control—but protected out of care. True trust is formed when we believe God's limits are for our good. See Genesis 2:16, 17.	
3.	God Walked	—Presence Was Personal.
	Before sin entered, God walked in the See Genesis 3:8.	e garden with Adam and Eve. His presence was relational, not transactional. Trust was rooted in nearness.
4.	God	After the Fall, Not in Anger but with a Question.
	God's first response to their disobedience wasn't punishment—it was a question: 'Where are you?' He invited connection rather than condemnation. See Genesis 3:9.	
5.	God	Their Shame and Pointed to Redemption.
	Even in discipline, God moved with mercy. He covered their shame with garments He made—a foreshadowing of Christ's covering. God doesn't abandon us when trust breaks—He redeems. See Genesis 3:21.

1.	You trust people who 'get you.' They	listen, empathize, and validate your perspective without quick fixes.
2.	Trust is built when the other person's	heart is for you, not just for their own interests. You feel safe when someone genuinely wants your good.
3.	Cood intentions and the same West	
4.	Good intentions aren't enough. We tr	rust people who are competent—who have the skills, wisdom, or experience to follow through.
5.		when it costs them. Integrity, humility, and consistency over time shape deep trust.
