Trust releases revenge and believes in God's redemptive plan. Genesis 50:19-21.

The 5 Essentials of Trust

- 1. <u>Understanding</u> → You trust people who 'get you.' They listen, empathize, and validate your perspective without quick fixes.
- 2. <u>Motive</u> \rightarrow Trust is built when the other person's heart is for you, not just for their own interests. You feel safe when someone genuinely wants your good.
- 3. Ability -> Good intentions aren't enough. We trust people who are competent—who have the skills, wisdom, or experience to follow through.
- 4. Character→ You trust those who do the right thing when it costs them. Integrity, humility, and consistency over time shape deep trust.
- 5. <u>Track Record</u> → Trust is strengthened when someone has shown up again and again—when they've proven themselves trustworthy through real-life situations.

CHARACTER: The Fourth Essential of Trust

Character is the inner structure that enables a person to handle demands of reality well. Character is not just about being nice—it's about having the emotional, moral, and spiritual capacity to follow through.

Joseph demonstrates deep character through perseverance, self-restraint, and forgiveness. He doesn't break under pressure; he deepens. He doesn't seek vengeance; he restores. His decisions are not based on what he feels, but on who he trusts.

Four traits of trustworthy character:

- 1. Grace and Truth The ability to offer mercy while still holding to what is right.
- 2. Ownership The capacity to take responsibility without blaming others.
- 3. Emotional Regulation Staying grounded under pressure.
- 4. Empathy Choosing connection over control.

Joseph's rise wasn't just a change in circumstances—it was a reflection of the kind of man he had become. Trustworthy. Faithful. Formed by character.

Genesis 39:6-15 - 6 and all Potiphar had to concern himself with was eating three meals a day. 7 As time went on, his master's wife became infatuated with Joseph and one day said, "Sleep with me."8 He wouldn't do it. He said to his master's wife, "Look, with me here, my master doesn't give a second thought to anything that goes on here - he's put me in charge of everything he owns.9 He treats me as an equal. The only thing he hasn't turned over to me is you. You're his wife, after all! How could I violate his trust and sin against God?" 10 She pestered him day after day after day, but he stood his ground. He refused to go to bed with her. 11 On one of these days he came to the house to do his work and none of the household servants happened to be there. 12 She grabbed him by his cloak, saying, "Sleep with me!" He left his coat in her hand and ran out of the house.13 When she realized that he had left his coat in her hand and run outside, 14 she called to her house servants: "Look - this Hebrew shows up and before you know it he's trying to seduce us. He tried to make love to me but I yelled as loud as I could. 15 With all my yelling and screaming, he left his coat beside me here and ran outside."

<u>Genesis 40:12-23 - 12</u> Joseph said, "Here's the meaning. The three branches are three days. <u>13</u> Within three days, Pharaoh will get you out of here and put you back to your old work - you'll be giving Pharaoh his cup just as you used to do when you were his cupbearer. <u>14</u> Only remember me when things are going well with you again - tell Pharaoh about me and

get me out of this place. 15 I was kidnapped from the land of the Hebrews And since I've been here, I've done nothing to deserve being put in this hole."16 When the head baker saw how well Joseph's interpretation turned out, he spoke up: "My dream went like this: I saw three wicker baskets on my head; 17 the top basket had assorted pastries from the bakery and birds were picking at them from the basket on my head."18 Joseph said, "This is the interpretation: The three baskets are three days; 19 within three days Pharaoh will take off your head, impale you on a post, and the birds will pick your bones clean."20 And sure enough, on the third day it was Pharaoh's birthday and he threw a feast for all his servants. He set the head cupbearer and the head baker in places of honor in the presence of all the guests. 21 Then he restored the head cupbearer to his cupbearing post; he handed Pharaoh his cup just as before.22 And then he impaled the head baker on a post, following Joseph's interpretations exactly. 23 But the head cupbearer never gave Joseph another thought; he forgot all about him.

<u>Genesis 50:19-21 - 19</u> Joseph replied, "Don't be afraid. Do I act for God?<u>20</u> Don't you see, you planned evil against me but God used those same plans for my good, as you see all around you right now - life for many people.<u>21</u> Easy now, you have nothing to fear; I'll take care of you and your children." He reassured them, speaking with them heart-to-heart.
