RECEIVING THE GIFT OF FORGIVENSS. Have you ever wondered what gift you would most like to receive—the one that would change everything about your life? This Christmas, the greatest gift offered to us is the forgiveness of Jesus, a gift that heals, restores, and sets us free. Before we can give forgiveness to anyone else, we must first experience the joy of receiving it personally and deeply. When we unwrap God's grace toward us, it becomes the starting point for a life transformed. This could be the BEST CHRISTMAS EVER as we receive the gift that changes everything—His forgiveness.

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Scripture anchors this truth:

- 1. Isaiah 1:18 "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow..."
- 2. Psalm 32:1–2 "Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven..."
- 3. Ephesians 1:7 "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins..."

The biblical story is full of men who needed forgiveness: David, Peter, and the Prodigal Son—men who experienced failure, brokenness, shame, and ultimately restoring grace.
